It's almost an opportunity for humans to reintroduce themselves to the animal kingdom of the Australian bush in a less predatory way", says Wendy Bithell.

Located next to Tallebudgera Creek on West Burleigh Road, West Burleigh Vision Walks Guided Night tours at the David Fleay Wildlife Park commence on Thursday May 29th and will continue on a weekly basis Every Thursday night.
